Academic Coach

OVERVIEW

Academic coaches work under the direction of a lead coach to support students in a homeschool learning environment at the Rochester Christian Learning Center. Academic coaches must love children and have a desire to assist in instructing a Christian-based curriculum. Coaches support parents by assisting students with instruction in various academic subjects including reading, math, language skills, history, Bible lessons, science, etc. Academic coaches may instruct in one or more academic subjects as they are called to assist.

QUALIFICATIONS

Academic coaches will:

- Subscribe to the First Congregational Church of Rochester Statement of Faith as printed on the back of this form.
- Have a desire to educate children in the ways of the Lord (Proverbs 22:6, Train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old he will not depart from it.)
- Maintain the highest level of Christian values.
- Demonstrate the fruit of the Spirit: Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Gentleness, Faithfulness Goodness, and Self Control.

DUTIES

Academic coaches will:

- Coach all subject matter assigned by the lead coach in the designated grade in accordance with the class curriculum.
- Maintain high expectations for academic performance of students.
- Provide classroom environment conducive to academic excellence.
- Comply with Learning Center Policies as set forth in the following:
 - Student and Family Handbook.
 - Volunteer Handbook
 - other policies as issued.
- Possess the understanding that children learn at various levels.
- Allow for more time with children who require more assistance grasping concepts.
- Assist lead coach during extracurricular activities and field trips.



First Congregational Church of Rochester Statement of Faith

- WE BELIEVE there is one God, who is infinitely perfect, existing eternally in three persons: God the Father, His only Son Jesus Christ, and the Holy Spirit (Deuteronomy 6:4; Matthew 5:48; Matthew 28:19).
- WE BELIEVE the Old and New Testaments are verbally inspired by God and are the complete revelation of His will for the salvation of people. They constitute divine guidance of Christian faith and practice (2 Peter 1:20–21; 2 Timothy 3:15–16).
- WE BELIEVE that Jesus Christ is fully God and fully man. The Scripture declares His virgin birth; His sinless life; His miracles; His substitutionary death on the cross; His bodily resurrection from the dead; and His exaltation to the right hand of God (Matthew 1:18–23; Hebrews 7:26; 1 Peter 2:22; 1 John 3:4–5; Acts 2:22; 10:37–38; Hebrews 2:9; Matthew 28:1–6; Acts 1:9,11; Philippians 2:9–11).
- WE BELIEVE the Holy Spirit is a divine person sent to dwell, guide, teach, and empower the believer and to convince the world of sin, righteousness, judgment, and to discover freedom (John 14:15–18; John 16:13; Acts 1:8; John 16:7–11; 1 Corinthians 3:17).
- WE BELIEVE that salvation has been provided through Jesus Christ for all people. Those who repent and believe in Him are born again of the Holy Spirit, receive the gift of eternal life, and become the children of God (Titus 3:4–7).
- WE BELIEVE that it is the will of God that each believer should be filled with the Holy Spirit, growing rapidly in faith, separating himself from sin and the world, fully dedicating himself to the will of God, and thereby receiving power for holy living and effective service (1 Thessalonians 5:23; Acts 1:8; Romans 6:1–14).
